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Mechanisms for continuous feedback

Feedback is obtained from students in a structured and formal manner at the end of each semester using a prescribed format. The collected feedback is systematically analyzed by the respective Heads of the Departments, and a consolidated summary is prepared. This analysis primarily helps in identifying gaps and weaknesses in the teaching–learning process. Based on the findings, the faculty members are counseled and guided by the Heads of the Departments to enhance instructional effectiveness and overall academic delivery.

In addition, feedback from other stakeholders such as alumni, employers, industry representatives, and professional body members is collected annually to assess the relevance and adequacy of the curriculum. The inputs received are reviewed and discussed by the College Academic Committee. Identified gaps and suggested improvements are deliberated upon, ratified, and formally communicated to the affiliating University for necessary modifications. The institution actively participates in curriculum development by continuously assimilating stakeholder feedback and incorporating feasible suggestions into its academic and functional practices.
